#### Feminism

- The basis of feminism is gender inequality
- "Women are disadvantaged because of their sex" (how things are)
- "This disadvantage can and should be overthrown" (how things should be)

#### Feminism

• **Patriarchy**: "Literally, rule by the father; often used more generally to describe the dominance of men and subordination of women in society at large."

# First-wave feminism (1850s-~1950s)

- Sexual equality in the areas of political and legal rights
- Equal chance to find a job
- Equal opportunities
- Equal pay (new)
- Suffrage rights (voting rights, universal suffrage)
- Quotas

#### First-wave feminism (1850s-~1950s)

- Mary Wollstonecraft A Vindication of the Rights of Woman (1792)
- "wives are not the property of their husbands"
- the role of women in education

- 1968 social movements the sexual revolution
- women's liberation rather than political rights
- Critique of patriarchy
- Greater sexual freedom

- The difference between sex and gender
- Sex (biological difference)
- Gender (social and cultural distinction between male and female)
- Sex (nature) Gender (nurture/culture)
- Simone de Beauvoir The Second Sex (1949)
- "Women are made, they are not born"

- Public sphere (politics, education, careers, art, literature)
- Private sphere (family, caring, child-rearing, domestic work)
- Politicization of the private realm
- "personal is political"
- Betty Friedan The Feminine Mystique (1963), "the problem with no name"

- Ann Oakley The Sociology of Housework (1974), family, socialization
- "brave boy, pretty girl"
- Dale Spender Man Made Language (1980), language
- Kate Millett Sexual Politics (1970), a genderless, androgynous persona
- A woman like **Margaret Thatcher** (former prime minister of the UK) does not help, "behaves like men"

# Third-wave feminism (~1990s)

- Facilitate a wide spectrum of choice and ensure equality of opportunity
- Different ways to be a woman and feminine are acknowledged
- Differences rather than "sisterhood" are emphasized
- The restrictive and policing attitude of the second-wave feminism is dismissed
- Pro-woman feminism, difference feminism
- Naomi Wolf *The Beauty Myth* (1991)

## Three Versions of Feminism

- Liberal Feminism (political and individual rights, individual choice)
- Socialist Feminism (socialist revolution, social inequality)
- Radical feminism (empowerment, "personal is political", genderless persona)

#### Feminist Lexicon

- Empowerment when an individual or social group gains a greater influence over their own lives and society as a whole
- **Glass ceiling** a term used to describe those barriers which face women and ethnic minorities aiming for promotion in the workplace
- Misogyny a prejudicial hatred of women

# New feminism, postfeminism, feminism in a global age

- 1. Sex / Gender division
- Gender depends on culture, interest, intention, feeling...
- Queer theory, LGBT communities, trans identities etc.
- 2. Sex / Gender division
- Even sex is <u>not</u> that biological (rites of passage, interventions on our bodies)
- Sex is determined on what grounds exactly; genital organs, hormones, genes)? In some cases may be hard to determine.
