Political Ideologies Theory & History

- Born out of American (evangelical) Protestantism in early 20th Century
- Commonly associated with inflexibility, dogmatism, authoritarianism and sometimes violence
- **Theocracy**: "The principle that religious authority should prevail over political authority usually through the domination of church over the state"

• <u>Core</u>

- Politicization of religion
- Religion everywhere, no public/private distinction

• **Clash of civilizations:** "The theory that, in the post-Cold War world, conflict would not be primarily ideological and economic, but rather cultural in character"


- Reaction against moral decay, corruption, "sick old world"
- Utopian
- <u>Puritanism</u> "I want to take apart the entire political and philosophical structure of modernity and return to Islam to its unpolluted origins" – *Sayyid Qutb*
- Moral absolutism
- Patriarchal with women
- Anti-modernism, anti-west?

- Elitist (only a group of privileged people have access to and know what the "truth" is)
- The source of truth **unchangeable** and **unchallengeable**
- Orthodoxy
- No room for relativity (not only in religion, but in every aspect of life as part of religion)

- Scriptual literalism: "A belief in the literal truth of sacred texts, which as the revealed word of God, have unquestionable authority reducing the complexity and profundity of the text"
- Accepting one and only interpretation as "true" and "religious" and declaring others as "false" and "unreligious" (the practice of excommunication)
- Not only intolerant of other religions, but other interpretations of the same religion
- Fundamentalism X Relativism

- Militancy
- Totalitarianism (abolishing all civil institutions, civil society and private life)
- Millenarianism: "A belief in a 1000-year period of divine rule; political millenarianism offers the prospect of a sudden and complete emancipation from misery and oppression"
- Apocalypticism: "A belief in the imminent end of the world (as we know it), often associated with the return of a supreme or God-like figure denoting final solution and purification"
